Drop Off and Pick Up:

Lunch:

Students will have lunch at approximately 11:30 each day. Lunches are stored inside a cool building, but not refrigerated. Water, sports drink or juice are recommended.

Areas of Study and Hands-on Fun

Canoes and Kayaks

Campers will learn about Virginia Indians, their culture and their use of the waterways. We'll also learn how to burn out a dugout canoe. At the end of the day, students will spend time paddling a canoe or kayak in the York River.

Skiffs and Dinghies

Campers will learn about different uses for small rowing vessels. Discussion items will include lofting a boat design, drawing, and assembly of a 14-foot crabbing skiff. At the end of the day, students will row the skiff in the York River.

Sailing Ships

Campers will learn about the parts of a sailing ship. Weather permitting, students will ride aboard the Schooner Alliance.

Workboats

The Skipjack, Deadrise, and Buy Boat are the iconic workboats of the late 19th and 20th century. You'll learn about each boat's design, and about crabbing, oystering and more. We'll also discuss aquaculture and how it is changing the fish and shellfish industry.

Modern Boats

There are various types of modern boats used by professionals on the water. You'll learn about many types of these boats and also learn about boating safety and navigation.

Conflicts and Weather Plan

Schedules may shift in response to personnel or boat availability. No one will be in/on the water during periods of dangerous weather.
